This map assesses the distribution population 60 years old and over by country. The age structure of a population affects a nations key socioeconomic issues. Countries with young populations (high percentage under age 15 , need to invest more in schools, while countries with older populations (high percentage ages 60 and over, need to invest more in the health sector. The age structure can also be used to help predict potential political issues. For example, the rapid growth of a young adult population unable to find employment can lead to unrest.
